Harry Ransom Humanities Research Center

Description:

The Harry Ransom Humanities Research Center invites applications for its research fellowships. The fellowships enable scholars to pursue research projects in all areas of the humanities. Approximately 50 fellowships are awarded annually. Priority will be given to proposals that concentrate on the center's collections and that require substantial onsite use of them.

The center awards fellowships of one to three months, with funding at \$3,000 per month. Travel stipends worth \$1,200 to \$1,700 may be awarded to scholars with research projects that require less than one month's research at the center.

The fellowships available are as follows:

- the American Society for 18th century Studies: two fellowships, jointly sponsored with the Ransom Center, for literary, cultural or historical study. Applicants must be members of ASECS at the time of application;
- the British Studies fellowship for research in British literary, cultural, and historical subjects;
- the Cline fellowships for research on 19th or early 20th century British topics;
- the Robert De Niro endowment fund for film research, especially in the center's Robert De Niro collection;
- the Dorot Foundation fellowships in Jewish studies for research on Jewish authors and on relevant cultural topics requiring research in the center's collections. These fellowships may be extended to three months or, exceptionally, for longer periods;
- the David Douglas Duncan endowment for photojournalism for research in the center's photography collections;
- the TS Eliot editorial fellowship, jointly sponsored by the University of London Institute of English Studies and the Ransom Center, for scholars working on the TS Eliot editorial project. Applicants must be affiliated with the IES.
- the Filmscript Acquisitions Endowment for research in the Center's film collections;
- the Fleur Cowles fellowships: two are available for research on topics related to 20th century art, journalism, women's studies, and general literature and culture;
- the Edwin Gale fellowship for research on Jewish writers, photographers, artists, performers and the Jewish presence in culture as represented in the Ransom Center's collections, while providing affiliated with the Schusterman Center for Jewish Studies at the University of Texas at Austin;
- the Erle Stanley Gardner endowment for mystery studies supports research on topics related to mystery and suspense;
- the Hobby Family Foundation fellowship for research in general literary studies;
- the Alfred A and Blanche W Knopf fellowship for research in the areas of publishing and general literary studies, with special emphasis given to research concerning Knopf authors;
- Limited Editions Club for research in the center's rare book and print collections, with emphasis given to work with illustrated books;
- the Norman Mailer endowed fund for research related to Norman Mailer's writings, times and the archive;

- the Andrew W Mellon Foundation: a number of fellowships are available in general literary and cultural studies. These fellowships may be extended to three months
- the Marlene Nathan Meyerson photography fellowship for research in the center's photography collections;
- the Cora Maud Oneal fellowship for research in general literary studies;
- the Pforzheimer endowment: two fellowships are available for research in the Pforzheimer collection as well as in general Renaissance studies;
- the Warren Skaaren film research endowment supports research in the center's film collections;
- the CP Snow fellowship for research in general literary and cultural studies, with a special emphasis on the relationship of literature and science;
- the Weinsten memorial fellowship for research in 20th-century American literature;
- the Woodward and Bernstein endowment supports research on topics related to Watergate, the First Amendment and the press.

Six dissertation fellowships jointly sponsored by the Ransom Center and the University of Texas at Austin Office of Graduate Studies are designated for graduate students who are working on doctoral dissertations. Dissertation fellowship residencies must be taken up during the period from September 1, 2012 through August 31, 2013. There is not a specific required length of residency for dissertation fellowships.

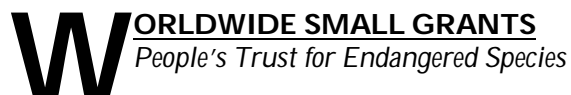

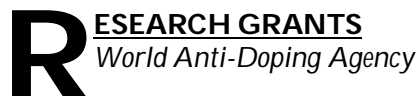
